Thanks to the assistance of David Dunn and other club members after our lunch stop we removed the pulley and fan wired in the crank pin to prevent it from falling out allowing me to crank the car and continue on our way, I have now had 5 new tyres, new crank / fan pulley and new radiator hoses all fitted with the Jaffa and thankfully it hasn't missed a beat since. That is of course until the 60th Anniversary Run- and you all know what happened - Jaffa was trailered home from Port Augusta.

This has not dampened my spirits I Look forward to many more enjoyable club events and memories with the club while driving the Jaffa.

Since returning from the 60th Anniversary Run Rosina and I have sat back and recapped many aspects of the journey. It was very pleasing to get to Port Augusta with just 1 Model 'T' needing help. On a personal note, it was very enjoyable to have our 2 daughters and 3 grandchildren on the Pichi-Richi railway with us, this is a journey that I have had on my bucket list for a very long time and to share it with my family is something that I will always cherish. Some of you may know that my Model 'T' Ford came from Peterborough. On April 29th, 1926, it was purchased by Mr. S. Garard from Yongala for 179 pounds 10 shillings. I have always wanted to check out the garage from which my 'T' came from. We had a few hours to spare between the Museum and the Light Show. So, Rosina and I went walking along the Main Street to do some detective work and get some answers.


Firstly, we called into the Post Office, I asked the chap at the counter, if he knew of a Bill Smith Motor and Cycle Works, which was on the original re-

ceipt I have. He knew of a Bill Smith, but he had passed away and his brother Jack took over the business, he said "the garage is on the right towards Steamtown, he told us that there is a Senior Citizen Club on the same side of the road and encouraged us to give them a visit." So off we went, we found the Seniors Club, I walked in, there was about 8 to 10 people playing bowls, and they thought we were there for a game.



After asking about Jack Smith, a lady said, "I knew Jack, but he died a few years back, the garage still stands." the lady directed us to go further down the road and there it was the name had changed from Bill Smith to Jack

Smith, although the signage had changed the building was still the same. Dusty Mechanical Services are the current owners of the garage. Unfortunately, there was not anyone I could contact with at the garage. Interestingly enough Dusty Mechanical Services have the contract to service the ambulances in Peterborough. Mission completed.





I joined the club when Tony Russell was our President, around 1988/89. My interest in T Fords started when I was an engineering trainee with BHP in Whyalla after leaving the farm at Gulnare in 1960. We did a subject called workshop practice and it was all about the design of gearing and the practical use of gear cutting equipment. The gear box we studied was that from a T model. That got my interest and I asked all those I knew, who had had older buckboards on the farm, what was still laying about. I could remember a T model at Yacka, we had a 24 Dodge, next door had an A model, there was a Rugby and a Chev also. At that time, all said, I found nothing. By 1987 I had found an engine with a G Box attached so I was away. Then all the parts started arriving from farms.

Lasscock's nurseries was just down the road from home and they were a small client of ours. I dealt with Ian, but one day, John turned up in his T to the factory.

Within a couple of weeks I had joined the T Club.

1989 was the year the book, "Buzzerbox-First 25 years", was released.

I was given a rolling chassis for my 50th birthday. By the first Bay to Birdwood the T had no upholstery, no hood and Gordy quickly told me I had the steering wheel on back to front. I had never been able to drive a T, so I learnt the night before the Bay to Birdwood, when there was daylight at our factory yard. I reversed and went forward in the factory yard and then drove it home before dark as I had no lights, only some indicators.

Next morning we were off to the start I had 2 people with me one was the chap who, with the local mechanic at Gulnare, found the T at Spalding. The mechanic and my family were all going up in their moderns. Just as we got past Tea Tree Gully and were going up hill, cough/cough. Bill a mate from Gulnare who was part of finding the T, says, "You must be low in petrol. But we were over half full, so we had to wait for the RAA to arrive, top us up to keep going. The mob at Birdwood had no idea where we were as none of us had mobiles then.

I joined the Committee and Rally Committee for Ts alive in 95. Then Ts Galore in 2004 and later Lizzies Convene in 2013. On occasions, when I could fit it all in with family events, I started to go on monthly runs. I was getting to know people in the club. The 95 Rally held in the valley was Sandra's first real introduction to the Club.

My first club auction day/swap meet was when we were at Parkside and those clubrooms were still being added to. Not soon after our last working bee they were burnt (torched?) down ,we will never know, and at the time I believe the local council was of no assistance to rebuild.

Buzzer Box at Gordy's, he cooked us scones. Those days we printed and collated the Buzzer box monthly. Wonderful evenings were had by all who attended. Later we moved to the clubroom at Croydon.

We have had many home bases. We moved from Parkside to Glenside and had a few meetings at the Burnside Town Hall. There were others. Maybe somebody could list them all. Then we found Croydon and started renovating it to suite our needs. What a job that was. But as usual we had great volunteers to assist and got the job done. We must have moved in prior to completion. It was 1997/98 before we were really in.

Over the years we have attended many great events, from runs to Rallies especially those we had in South Australia. We had many wonderful dinners and lunches, especially our 50th and 60th dinners. Today we see the new clubrooms emerging. As you are reading this we will most



likely be getting ready for our first General Meeting and AGM in the new rooms. (We hope to see you all there!)

We enjoyed our activities at club events, especially when lunch or dinner was involved, some of the morning teas are to be remembered.

Lots of wonderful camaraderie and friendship over the years. May the Club prosper in the future as we move into new era in our new clubrooms.

By the time this article is read by members, the Club would have moved into the new Clubrooms. Whilst there are certain minor defects and outstanding works yet to be completed by various subcontractors and fit-out works by the Club, the building is being established as our new home at its great location at Lot 11 Port Road Plantation Croydon. What a great milestone to be achieved

in the long journey.



The soft landscaping is progressing, despite several delays due of indement weather. For the great reveal, the barrier mesh will be removed once the soft landscaping has been completed.

The solar array and associated equipment had been subject to a late design change which has delayed installation but will commence in the very near future.

Whilst the Club has completed the Stage 1 relocation of the bulk of its possessions from Fawk Reserve Hall, the last meeting of its nine (9) Hiring Clubs will occur there on Tuesday 2 July 2024. Our Club will be the first club to conduct its meetings at Croydon, being for the General and Annual General Meetings on Wednesday 3 July 2024.

In an attempt to attract further hiring of the Clubrooms, two 'Hall for Hire' signs have been strategically placed on the facade of the building. It is to be remembered that our Club and its fourteen (14) Hiring Clubs at

the time had their last meetings at the former Clubrooms in this location in November 2021.


The Club has now received into its bank account the grant funding from the

MINUTES OF LAST GENERAL MEETING, 1ST MAY 2024:

5.1. As distributed in the June 2024 edition of Buzzer Box.

Moved: Brian Teakle, that the minutes be accepted; Seconded: Stuart Bowshall; Carried.

6. BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES OF THE LAST GENERAL MEETING:

6.1. Exhaust pipes: Ten (10) stainless steel pipes are now available for members to purchase at \$100 each; 2027 National Rally: An initial organisational meeting has been rescheduled for Tuesday 11 June 2024 at 6pm at Fawk Reserve Hall and members are invited to register their interest to attend.

7. VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

7.1. The Vice President advised: The Committee has been busy; A meeting was conducted with the Hiring Clubs and will be reported further in the Project Manager's Report; The Vietnamese Community Group /Quin Tran's quest for Fawk Reserve Hall after our Club vacates, Odyssey will remain under the Vietnamese Community Group umbrella, the Group has something happening every day but elsewhere at the moment, our Club will be invited to some functions; Mid-Year Dinner list on front table, listed names will be emailed to the Secretary after the meeting.

Moved: Peter Perry, that the Vice President's Report be accepted; Seconded: Rod Crawford; Carried.

8. SECRETARY'S REPORT:

- In the Secretary's absence, the Vice President reported Correspondence In: The usual club magazines were received and forwarded/provided to Neil Hofmeyer for inclusion in the Library.
- 8.2. The Vice President reported Correspondence Out: Follow up emails to Hiring Clubs providing updates of Clubrooms progress; Email sent to members inviting them to a meeting to discuss the 2027 National Rally and invite suggestions for a Rally slogan (with some responses already received about attendance or not and/or slogans).
- 8.3. The Vice President advised: Some members have questioned why is it necessary to commence the planning for the 2027 National Rally so early to which the response was there was much work to be done and the Club needs to make a presentation about the 2027 National Rally at the 2025 National Rally in Ballarat; The Club has become aware of an extensive number of manuals for sale. A hard copy of this 16-page list is on the front table for review and is available to anyone interested email the Secretary for an electronic copy.

10.1. The Vice President reported: Thanks to all contributors of the June 2024 edition; Apologies for several errors discovered after printing; A reminder that when renewing your membership and you want to continue to receive your Buzzer Box by mail from and including the August 2024 edition, tick the box and pay an additional \$5.

11.TREASURER'S REPORT:

- 11.1. Kingsley Taylor advised: The reconciliation of accounts for the month of June 2024; a reconciliation is available for viewing after the meeting; The current investment account is intended to serve as the start-up for the conduct of the 2027 National Rally.
- 11.2. Kingsley Taylor raised the matter of the SA Car Clubs Program requiring a separate bank account for the purposes of the financial administration of a project to supply and install an additional solar battery in the new Croydon Clubrooms and funded by the SA Car Clubs Program grant of \$30k.

Motion: Proposed by Paul Van Ruth, that the Model T Ford Club of Australia Inc open a new bank account for the purposes of the financial administration of a project to supply and install an additional solar battery in the new Croydon Clubrooms and funded by the SA Car Club Program grant of \$30k. The signatories of this account shall be: Adam Jones, Kingsley Taylor, David Carver, Mik Bojko and John Eastick; Seconded: Ian Russell; The motion was unanimously carried by members present.

Moved: Anthony Russell, that the Treasurer's Report be accepted; Seconded: Ian Russell; Carried.

12.PROJECT MANAGER'S REPORT:

12.1. John Eastick updated members on progress since the last General Meeting and article in the June 2024 edition of Buzzer Box: Practical Completion was issued on Friday 31 May 2024: This has triggered a number of actions, being steps to issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy and a line in the sand for immediate defects rectification; Landscaping commenced on Monday 3 June 2024 and will take about 2 weeks; Permanent power was connected today after long delays due to process problems; Certain additional works soon to commence: E-W tilt frames on solar panels on upper level roof; Chair rail allround the Meeting Room; Meeting with Hiring Clubs on Monday 20 May 2024 at which these clubs were advised of what is happening for the transition back to Croydon: General Meetings commence at Croydon from Wednesday 3 July 2024 (being ourselves); Induction sessions currently planned for 3rd week of June 2024; Working Bees: Two already held with further ones planned; Next one is moving day #1, hopefully next week please write your name on list on the front table: Club is engaging a removalist for a day: Lease still awaited for review and signing, in the knowledge it is the same as we have had both at Croydon and Fawk Reserve Hall; Whilst the Committee has a general understanding of the potential costs that will appear in the Schedule forming a part of the Lease, details are commercial in confidence; Social Inclusion Discounts: Our Club reached out to Hiring Clubs to assist in the application: Statistics for resident clubs -1,775 combined membership and 193 combined residents in Council area; Supported by the Government of South Australia, the SACCP Grant for an additional solar battery was

successful for \$30k and there is a preliminary plan in place to action the works; Club equity becomes \$1.03m; 'Hall for Hire' signage approved to attach to the new building; Building Opening: awaiting feedback from Council; Fawk Reserve Hall: Our Club will be extending the lease to support Odyssey and the Vietnamese Community Group to remain here up to and after we completely leave and Council enters into a new arrangement with our Club's successor.

12.2. A question was asked by Ian Russell: What are the terms for hiring the clubrooms: A: Long term hire only and not casual one-off functions.

16.1. Rod Crawford reported: There had been no meetings of the Federation and therefore nothing to report.

- 17.1. Registration Day on Sunday, 19 May 2024; Organiser: Committee; Brian Teakle said it was a well organised day; Ian Russell spoke of how he saw so many new faces and encouraged people to bring out their cars on runs.
- Old Crocks Run on 5 May 2024: Adam Jones, the Crawfords and the Hills attended; Rod Crawford spoke of his experience and certain feedback that he had received – see item 20.1 below.

Repeat layers finish with lasagne sheets.


Spread remaining soup and sprinkle remaining cheese.


MODEL T FORD TINKERING BITS – CONTINUED No 10 POSITION OR SPARK AND THROTTLE LEVERS

The following chart to be used as a guide for the positions of the Spark and Fuel levers on the quadrant as situated on the steering column for various conditions for the vehicle operation.

Please remember these are only as a guide as your vehicle may operate slightly different.

These are the follow on from those produced in TT No 9

8 For hill dimbing while in low gear, advance the spark lever five or six notches and open the fuel as needed, under no situation should you race the engine.



For hill dimbing while in top gear, retard the spark so as it will be advanced only two
or three notches. Open the fuel to extreme. As soon as the engine begins to labour
put it into low gear and set the spark and fuel as set below.




The Model T Ford service manual suggests that the valve springs be checked for strength when ever the valves are reground or replaced. This check is made by compressing the spring to 2-1/8" and the tension measured with a spring tension gauge. Yes, not every Model Towner has a spring tension gauge in their tool box.

A simple device that will do the job can be made using a 2-1/4" long set screw or bolt with a large washer held under the head of the bolt with a retaining nut. The distance from the bottom of the washer to the end of the bolt should measure 2-1/8". Either grind off the end of the bolt to length or add additional washer under the head.

Place the spring to be measured on your household bathroom scales and place the bolt on top of the spring so the hangs into the spring and is held on top of the spring by the large washer. Press down on the washer until the bolt end just bottom and read the pounds or

EASIER FAN BELT INSTALLATION

Replacing the fan belt can always be counted upon to skin a f knuckles unless the crank ratchet, part No 3906 is removed, an awesome task unless a person uses one of those accessory ratchet retaining pins that are easily popped out. A permanent fix can be affected by removing the crank ratchet to your work bench vice and cutting about 1/4" off the end the next time a belt has to be changed.

Besides giving additional room when the next belt has to be changed, the ratchet can be pulled farther to the front, giving more room to replace the cotter pin in the crank handle retaining pin.

This modification will not impair the function of the crank ratchet nor cause any difficulty, should it be necessary to use the crank. Using a hack saw properly is an art that many have not mastered, so if your cut is not straight, the end of the starting ratchet can be easily trued on a grinder, or if you a lucky to have a lathe use that.




