After the 9/11 incident, the issues in relation to Public Liability Insurance for preservation group as well as other community groups totally changed and many groups became passive groups and some even closed up, so I needed another direction to flow towards.

Both Rosa and I made a decision to check out the possibilities of acquiring a vintage car, what type? As a small child I remembered hearing my father talk about while he was a boy and sinking wells in the bush with his father, he often spoke about

how they had a T ford and it went up hills better in revere than forward, so we decided to look for one of those

I sent an email to the Model T Ford club or Australia through the Bennett family, an add was placed on our behalf in the Buy, Sell or Swap section of the buzzer box. It took approximately a month before we heard anything then I received a call advising me of a 1923 Tourer for sale and what a good buy it would be, after checking the vehicle out a couple of times we purchased it, Trevor Norley owned the car and had decided that it was time to move it on. Martilda as we named her was soon parked in our garage.



Many hours were spent checking the vehicle over and personalising the car before I took it out on the road, I had never driven a Model T before so it was time to learn to drive it, we had to do a minor running gear overhaul before we could venture off to Windsor in September 2010.

Approximately 2 years after acquiring my first Model T, one Saturday morning In the Cars of Distinction of the Advertiser, I noticed a 1921 T Ford Roadster for sale in Myponga with a Duncan and Frazer body, luckily, we were heading that way to visit my in laws, so we dropped in to take a look.

As the vehicle looked unique and also came with a supply of parts, we purchased it, only to find out that it was Art Potter's vehicle and many club members had worked on it to finish the uncompleted unit after his passing.

On further investigation the vehicle originated from my birth town of Peterborough and belong to a lady called Mrs. O'Conner, the people who knew her have made the comment that she would speed everywhere and all car users in Peterborough would give her free rights to the streets. We named her "Lizzie".

As many of you may remember Friday afternoons were spent at Gordie Dunns home where several of us would tinker and pick Gordie's brain, He was a wealth of knowledge and always happy to share what he knew with all those who wished to learn, one Friday afternoon at the gathering, club members were talking about the delivery van that Neil Hofmeyer had and it was for sale, as displayed on the Front Page of this Buzzer Box.

After talking to Neil and many others a deal was done to acquire the van. While working on the car in the carport and personalising it to our requirements our Grandsons mother made comment that it looks like Ned Kelly's car, after explain-

ing to her he only rode a horse, we named the van "Neddie" from her comments.

In the last couple of years, the cars have not seen the bitumen roads, due to work requirements. The van was taken to Echuca for the Centenary of Ford and the National Rally in 2008, It has previously attended the National Rallies in Griffith, Barossa, Geelong and Goulburn.



We love Neddie but are still trying to arrange some type of sign writing for the sides to finish the van off, as you must remember what ever company you use its not permitted to be an existing company.

Our original T, Matilda is still undergoing an overhaul.

Not bad for a real GM supporter!!




IN HIS OWN WORDS

The story starts with a little Ransome tractor originally owned by my grandfather who used it on his weekender orchard at Morialta.

The brother of a longtime friend had his eyes on the little tractor for some time and eventually talked dad into selling it to him for \$20 so off it went to their farm at Cuddly Creek.

When we visited their new home we discovered they had a model T up in the back paddock. After many months of negotiations it was agreed the price would be the same amount as he paid for the tractor. - So, \$20 and the deal was done.

After years of work the Temerged from the shed in all its glory to be driven at every opportunity.

I think the first big adventure was probably the National Rally to Mt Buffalo. Mum and dad squeezed into the T and drove all the way there and back. I think the only major problem they had was from Bordertown to nearly home mum had to have her arm out the window to operate the windscreen wiper with a length of wire! In those days quite a few members would rather drive the T long distances than tow them on a trailer. Good on them! Mind you with the number and speed of the trucks on the road now it's probably not a good idea unless you can stay off the highways. Our recent Annual Run to Pt Augusta and back was a great event which we enjoyed tremendously, many thanks to the organizers and everyone who attended.

P.S. I can only remember one vehicle needing to be towed home and it wasn't a T of course!

Sorry Mr. Oates but Sally made me mention it, and I choose to forget the other car that also went home on a trailer, call it a seniors moment.

I think it was the last time the club went to Pt Augusta, where, with a recently fitted Ruckstall diff to the T, he allegedly passed the other participants doing 45 miles an hour!

Fortunately unlike mustangs (dig), that night at the Highway Motel in Pt Augusta, they were able to take a few shims out of a bigend bearing that was noisy (after the thrashing on the way up) and fixed it before lights out.

SULTANA CAKE - Very easy and very nice

Place into a saucepan,

250gms butter or marg

2 ½ cups sultanas

1 cup sugar

1 cup water

Bring to boil and simmer 3 mins.

Let cool and add

2 well beaten eggs and sifted together 1 cup Plain flour, 1 cup SR Flour and ½ teaspoon baking powder.

Cook in moderate oven for approx. 40 mins, depending on tin size used. (Large log tin takes 50 - 55mins)

CAKE MIX COOKIES

1 Box cake mix 2 eggs ½ cup vegetable oil 1 cup add ins like choc chips, M&M's, cranherries or nuts

Preheat oven to 180C. In a large bowl, mix together cake mix, eggs and oil until smooth. Add extra add ins. Scoop dough onto baking sheet about 2 inches apart. Bake 9 - 10 mins until edges lightly golden. Allow to cool on sheet for 3 - 4 mins before transferring to a wire rack.

By the time this article is read by members, our Club and its nine (9) Hiring Clubs would have all had their first meetings at the new Clubrooms.



- 1.2. The President welcomed everyone present to this meeting at the new Clubrooms, reminded members to sign the Attendance Record Book and advised that this meeting will be audio recorded for minute taking purposes and the recording will be deleted once the minutes have been accepted.
- 1.3. Visitors: Samantha Kimber and Linda (Lin) Warren.
- 1.4. The President hoped that everyone had enjoyed their sausage sizzle and thanked Doretta Hills for making the necessary purchases and Mik Bojko and Mathew Edwards who had cooked the BBQ, to enable us to enjoy the bite to eat before the commencement of this meeting.
- 1.5. The President provided a brief overview of the new Clubrooms pointing out the location of the various side rooms (Kitchen, Office, Library, Store Room and Store / Service Room) and their function, the toilets and the emergency exits each side of the Meeting Room.

2. APOLOGIES:

3. MYSTERY OBJECT:

Two objects, provided by Allan Bennett and David Kimber.

4. FUNDRAISING:

Doretta Hills initiated a raffle of seven prizes.

MINUTES OF LAST GENERAL MEETING, 5TH JUNE 2024:

As distributed in the July 2024 edition of Buzzer Box.

Moved: David Carver, that the minutes be accepted; Seconded: Ian Russell; Carried.

BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES OF THE LAST GENERAL MEETING:

Exhaust pipes: Reminder that there are ten (10) stainless steel pipes now available for members to purchase at \$100 each.

7. PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

7.1. The President provided condolences to Beth, Trevor and Maxine Martin and the greater Martin family for the passing of Beth's 103-year old sister Norma on 1 June 2024.

Moved: Nancy Bennett, that the President's Report be accepted; Seconded: Stuart Bowshall; Carried.

8. SECRETARY'S REPORT:

- The Secretary reported Correspondence In: The usual club magazines were received and forwarded/provided to Neil Hofmeyer for inclusion in the Library.
- 8.2. The Secretary reported Correspondence In and Out; Emails to Hiring Clubs; Emails to the Council; Emails to Proselec about the new alarm system at the Clubrooms.

Moved: Gary Warren, that the Secretary's Report be accepted; Seconded: Rod Crawford; Carried

9. MEMBERSHIP:

9.1. As of 30 June 2024, approximately 43 of our 144 member units had not yet renewed their memberships, noting that several had done so since that date; Unpaid Members are reminded that because you have not paid your membership to the Treasurer and had your Log Book signed by an Authorised Officer, you will be now be driving an unregistered vehicle/s.

- 9.2. A membership application was received from Samantha Kimber of Echunga. Samantha is David & Christine Kimber's daughter and drives a Model T Ford. The Committee recommends that Samantha be welcomed as an Associate Member.
- Moved: Alan Bennett, that the Associate Membership for Samantha Kimber be accepted Seconded: John Clarke; Carried.
- Associate Membership application received, proposed by Adam Jones and seconded by Gary Warren for Lin Warren of Penfield. Lin is the President's mother-in-law and wishes to join the Club.
- Moved: Dale La Vars, that the Associate Membership for Lin Warren be accepted; Seconded: Doretta Hills: Carried.
- 9.4 The President welcomed both Samantha and Lin to the Club and this was met with applause.

10. BUZZER BOX REPORT:

10.1. The Secretary reported: Thanks to all contributors of the July 2024 edition; Commencing with the August 2024 edition, only those members who indicated on their membership form that they wished to receive their Buzzer Box by post will receive it this way; Up to and including the July 2024 edition, Buzzer Box editions had been posted out according to the previous database; There may be a number of spare copies available at meetings and runs for members to take if they wished to have a hard copy, noting there are now only two left on the front table tonight.

11.TREASURER'S REPORT:

- 11.1. Kingsley Taylor advised: The reconciliation of accounts for the month of July 2024; a reconciliation is available for viewing after the meeting.
- Moved: Brian Teakle, that the Treasurer's Report be accepted; Seconded: Matthew Edwards; Carried.

12. PROJECT MANAGER'S REPORT:

- 12.1. John Eastick updated members on progress since the last General Meeting and article in the July 2024 edition of Buzzer Box.
- 12.2. Clubrooms Induction: Further to the President's brief overview at the commencement of the meeting. John explained access and egress and how it is best to move to the car park in the event of any emergency: Safety equipment – fire extinguishers located in Meeting Room adjacent entry door and inside the Kitchen, fire blanket inside the Kitchen, defibrillator and first aid kit inside the Kitchen on top of the fridges and chair lifter located in the Store Room; Lighting - explanation of switch operation in each room, some with sensors; Air conditioners are preset, go for two hours and turn off automatically; Audio Visual, Public Address, assisted hearing and communications hub equipment briefly outlined; Lease – received and under review and negotiation and the commercial terms are in confidence. Commencement Date: 1 July 2024 and runs in 2 x 5 year terms = 10 years; Certificate of Occupation was issued on Monday 24 June 2024; Hand Over took place on Tuesday 25 June 2024; Unpacking commenced on Wednesday 26 June 2024; Working Bees were held on 17 & 29 May, 11, 19, 21, 26 & 30 June and 1 July with more planned; Fawk Reserve Hall – continuing to lease, Odyssey staying and available to other Hirers until Council rolls out an expression of interest process to identify a successor to our Club; Status at Croydon – several defects outstanding, soft landscaping completed, solar panels and battery yet to be installed (after re-design and a further development approval), storage cupboards, display cabinets and various hangings installed and Honour Board will be installed within the next two weeks, curtains and /or blinds being investigated by the Committee; Hiring Clubs – Induction sessions will be conducted tomorrow night, start meetings from next Monday 8 July and Hall for Hire signs installed to encourage further utilisation: Council has approved a 2024/25 budget allocation of \$30k to assist the Club to fit-out the Clubrooms and ideas are currently being discussed

- by the Committee. Whilst this will attract additional rent but at 2.5% per annum, it is economic to draw on that budget and future user groups contribute through rent and membership fees.
- 12.3. A question was asked by Peter Mullins: How much does our Club charge as a hire fee? A: Kingsley Taylor responded to say that it is around \$70 per evening meeting and that the Club welcomes enquiry to hire during both the evening and the day and the hire fees do vary according to hours of use; Hirings considered are only long term and not one-offs.
- 12.4. A question was asked by Brian Teakle: How many Hiring Clubs have joined our Club here at Croydon; A: John Eastick responded to say nine (9), noting that when our Club was evicted from the former Clubrooms, there were fourteen (14) Hiring Clubs so we lost five (5) on the journey; any possibility that any of those that left could return; A: John responded to say unlikely from what he knew but never say never.
- 12.5. Microwave: John Clarke suggested that the Club Committee consider purchasing a new microwave from Club funds.

13. PROPERTY OFFICERS REPORT:

13.1. No report provided.

14. CLUBROOMS MAINTENANCE COORDINATOR REPORT:

- 14.1. Albert Jones reported that at Fawk Reserve Hall, he will be organising electrical and fire extinguisher testing and removing the under-bench water filters to transfer to and install at Croydon.
- 14.2. The Secretary reported that Rosa Yates had agreed to clean both Fawk Reserve Hall and Croydon in the short term.

15. CLUBROOMS BOOKING COORDINATOR REPORT:

15.1. In Bob Yates's absence, there was no report.

16. FEDERATION REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT:

- 16.1. Rod Crawford reported: In the general interests of historic vehicle safety, he raised the issue of their clear visibility using red rear lights at the last Federation Meeting. The Federation Secretary had raised the issue with Sarah Clark of the Department of Infrastructure and Transport.
- 16.2. Discussion ensured amongst members about the appropriate colour and intermittency of such lights; More information will follow.

17. EVENTS AND RUNS COORDINATOR'S REPORT:


